GOULBURN'S EASTGROVE WETLANDS EXCURSION

On Friday the 18th of March, year 11 Biology and Senior Science classes went on an excursion to the Goulburn Mulwaree Wetlands. The day started off trekking our way through the waist-high grass.

Once we arrived at our destination, we got our gum boots on, and were ready for a long day ahead of us. First we watched Caitlin and Jayde venture into the knee deep water. Hoping one of them, or even Mr Falconer, would fall in, we all had our cameras ready. Watching while they set up a transect, Mr Falconer was observing all the abiotic and biotic factors surrounding us. Cody tested his knowledge all throughout the day, asking about each different species he saw.

We were divided into groups of four and went off measuring all the abiotic factors. While doing this, Alyce and Sarah took a great risk, and persuaded by Ms Bailey telling them to go out further, ended up getting their feet wet. They were not impressed. Ms Bailey took a few students over to the Golf Club to go to the toilets. At the first mention of food half of the group jumped up and ran after her, navigating our way through the dangerous golf course, where there was a women's tournament going on.
