Students in Years 7 and 9 recently completed the NAPLAN tests in numeracy and literacy. It was very pleasing to see most of the students participate in these tests. When the students receive their results it is important to note that they will be compared to every other student in their year across Australia. Not only are our students compared to students in comprehensive schools, but also from wealthy private schools, selective schools, specialist high schools, inner city schools, and schools from remote regions. The results are very important to the teaching staff and provide a detailed diagnostic assessment of our students. As a result, appropriate support can be given to those students who need assistance.

With the introduction of EFTPOS in our school it was pleasing to see the large number of families who were quick to pay their children's fees. These fees provide our school with the opportunity to further enhance the teaching and learning resources that will assist the students in developing quality outcomes.

Congratulations to Paula Geary who was elected President of the P&C. Paula has a strong passion for Goulburn High School and she is very keen to make a difference to our school with the support of the committee.

## BRONZE DUKE OF EDINBURGH HIKE ON THE 19TH AND 20TH MARCH 2011

Namadgi National Park was the setting for the first Bronze Duke of Edinburgh expedition for 2011. The group was a mixture of experienced hikers and first time adventurers. This was a practice walk to give the participants a taste of life in the bush. Seventeen students spent two days walking in the park and camped overnight by the side of a small creek. Not even wild dog howls could keep some of the campers awake, although a few hardy souls tried to push themselves to stay awake all night. It was a great first hike for the new Bronze "Dukes". ## SILVER DUKE OF EDINBURGH WALK ON THE 1ST, 2ND AND 3RD APRIL 2011

Namadgi National Park was also the venue for the first Silver Duke of Edinburgh expedition

of the year. A more challenging adventure than the Bronze hike, this walk lasted for three days with two nights spent out in the bush. Eleven students took part in the expedition and this trip served as both a practice walk and a final test for two of the hikers. The walk followed a circular route through the park and passed through historical sites, including stockyards and old homesteads. The first night was spent in tents pitched around one of the old huts. As the evening wore on, the cold set in and the fireplace inside the hut was a popular place to be. The second day provided plenty of opportunities for navigation, bush bashing and getting wet feet. By the time the group reached the old sheep yards they were ready to settle down for a well earned rest. First light next morning revealed a glistening winter wonderland with a



thick frost covering everything around, including some boots left out by mistake. It was a fantastic way to spend a weekend. Thank you to Mrs. Slater and Bushman John for providing expertise and company on the trip.

## **CAREERS INFORMATION**

### TAX FILE NUMBERS

**Reminder**: Tax file numbers for any student **over the age of 13** can, and should, be obtained through school. The tax office will, in many cases, return applications for students if they are not submitted by the school. This is a very simple process and no documentation is required to be sent with the application.

Forms can be obtained from Mrs Kennedy and processing takes up to 6 weeks to complete. Numbers are sent to the students, not the school, so keep them safe.

TIP: everyone needs a tax file number, so don't wait until you need it for a job. Get it now!!

## \$43,000 Scholarship

Year 12 students who are considering studying Business or Commerce at university should consider the Bachelor of Accounting offered by the University of Technology in Sydney. This course offers a very attractive \$43,000 tax free scholarship, 11 months of full-time training and a 95% graduate employment rate.
