An exciting community partnership is underway between CHC Affordable Housing and the ACT Building and Construction Industry Association (ACTBCIA) to provide affordable accommodation for apprentices working in the ACT and region building and construction industry. This accommodation will be available for 1st and 2nd year apprentices experiencing financial hardship and/or difficulty finding affordable accommodation.

The accommodation to be known as Apprentice House will consist of a brand new 5 bedroom home located in Lyons which will open in January 2014. The house will be fully furnished each apprentice will have his or her own bedroom, ensuite and living area. Apprentices will pay 25% of their weekly wage for the accommodation and a contribution of \$70 per week to cover all food. This amount will also cover toiletries, cleaning agents and washing powder. Utilities will be individually billed by CHC.

ACTBCIA (a Not-for-Profit organisation was established specifically to source and/or provide affordable accommodation for apprentices) will support each apprentice who comes to live at Apprentice House through a program developed for those living in the home. Apprentices will have the opportunity to learn to manage all aspects of living in the home so they attain the skills to be able to move confidently to independent living in the wider community. Each apprentice will be responsible for cleaning his or her own living area, maintaining the common living areas including the garden and to cook the evening meal on a rostered basis with assistance from a qualified cook. Another important part of living in the home will be the fact that all the residents will be able to share and support each other as they will all be working as members of the building industry. There is also the added bonus that there will be house mentor/s who will be available 24/7 to support the apprentices. A Youth Engagement Worker will work with each apprentice to ensure they attain the necessary skills to move to independent living and to be able to meet life challenges.

up2now: From the completion of Year 10 students start to accumulate results for their RoSA – Record of School Achievement. Upon leaving school the school applies for the students ROSA to be finalised and supplied to the student. Currently the only data to be recorded on the RoSA are grades (from Year 10 and 11), however the Board of Studies has plans to add a record of a students Extra-Curricular activities and additional achievements.

Students currently in Year 10 and 11 are able to access http://up2now.net.au with a password that has been sent to their DET email. Any problems or questions please see Mrs Kennedy who will be monitoring student use of the program for the duration of the trial.

Board of Studies Students Online: Students in Years 10 -12 are able to access their Board of Studies e-records by activating their account at http://studentsonline.bos.nsw.edu.au. Students are able to check that their personal details and subject information are correct. At the completion of Year 10 and 11 students can access their RoSA grades, and in Year 12 students can access their HSC timetable and request for their final results to be sent as a text. There is also a lot of helpful information for students at various stages of their studies. All students must ensure that they activate their accounts and check in regularly
